TRADITION, CULTURE AND IDENTITY

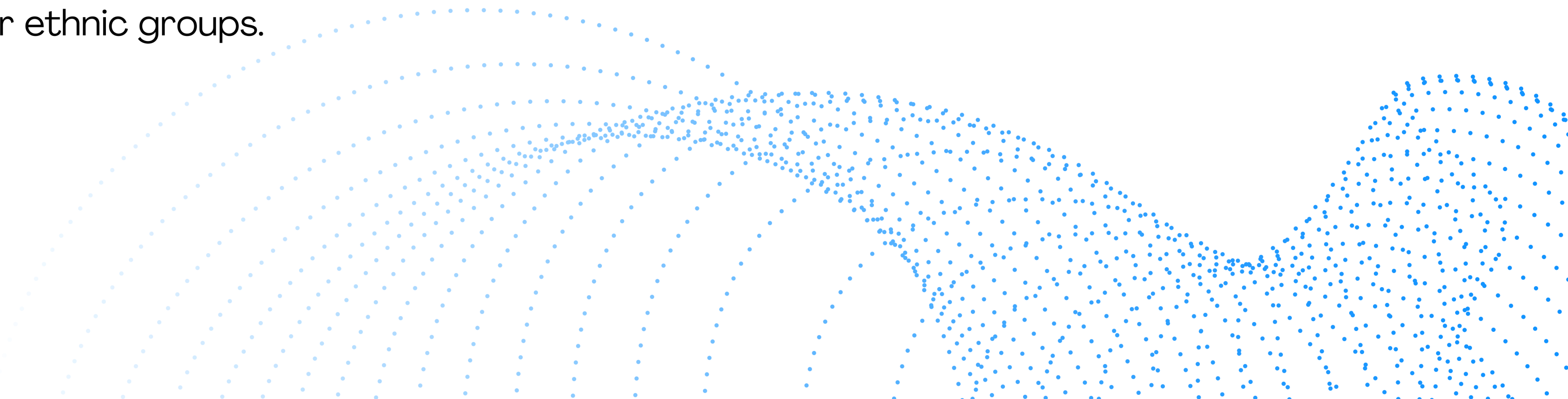

# Who did we talk to?



We asked 39 people to tell us about their culture and their perspective about the loss of culture. We decided to focus on teenagers, speaking with people with an age range between 13 and 18. The interviewed are from:

- Europe ( UK, Germany, Spain, Italy, Albania, France)
- South America ( Brazil, Colombia, Perù, Venezuela)
- Asia ( China, India)
- Africa (Morocco)

# What did we do?

We started our project by creating a questionnaire on the loss of traditions and cultural identity, and then published it and received feedback from students of all age groups in our school.

It was later extended to a wider audience by including people from a different state than ours.

After collecting the various results, we created graphs regarding the answers given to the questions asked of the respondents
